U-46 seniors named Illinois State Scholars

In recognition of their academic performance, more than 180 seniors at Elgin Area School District U-46's five comprehensive high schools received the Illinois State Scholar designation.

The award reflects approximately the top 10% of academic achievers among the Class of 2025 in Illinois.

The 181 students at Elgin, Bartlett, Larkin, South Elgin, and Streamwood high schools recently received notification of the honor from the Illinois Student Assistance Commission, the state agency that works to make education beyond high school accessible and affordable.

"We congratulate these exceptional students for this accomplishment. Their hard work and perseverance should not only be a source of pride for themselves, but it also inspires their peers and serves as an example of what can be achieved through dedication and determination," said Dr. Annette Acevedo, Assistant Superintendent of Schools. "We also recognize the vital role that parents, guardians, teachers, counselors, principals, and more have played in supporting and encouraging our Illinois State Scholars."

The U-46 honorees were among approximately 16,500 students from across the state who earned the designation, which was first introduced in 1958. The scholars are selected based on a formula that includes a combination of ACT/SAT test scores, class rank (if the school ranks) or the unweighted grade-point average (if the school does not rank), and class size.

The designation is a non-monetary award. State Scholars receive a congratulatory letter, a certificate of achievement, and a digital "badge" that can be displayed on social media platforms or shared through online profiles.

One more time, and in one of their last meetings as collegiate competitors, former South Elgin High School bowlers Karlea Ceasario, Monica Darrow and Kaylee Mann returned to the lanes.

They reunited Jan. 18-19 at the Kegel/Illinois State Bowling Proprietors Association (ISBPA) Midwest Collegiate Classic at Stardust Bowl in Addison.

Darrow is a senior bowler for St. Xavier University in Chicago, an elementary education major. Entering the season she was all over the Cougars record book, with three of the five highest single-game scores and program records for strike percentage, pins in a season and career, and scoring average, 187.1. She's topped that this year, 45th in the nation at 193.4 according to the United States Bowling Congress.

Mann, a senior graphic design major, has bowled four years at Judson University. She's having her best season in her last year of eligibility, according to Eagles coach Vince Biondo. Mann averages 178.6 pins a game and bowls a strike 38% of the time.

Ceasario graduated in December with a nursing degree from Aurora University, where she was a four-time College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin bowler of the week. She joined Judson one final semester for additional credits, and to bowl for the Eagles.

Biondo, a Hoffman Estates High School graduate and former Team USA bowler who lives in Carpentersville, recruited all three women.

Ceasario, Mann and Darrow bowled for South Elgin from 2018-21. They helped the Storm win Upstate Eight Conference titles four straight years with seventh- and 11th-place state finishes. Plus, third in the 2021 virtual state tournament.

(Several years ago Biondo had a fourth South Elgin teammate on his squad, Delaney Brown, but she moved out of state.)

On Jan. 18-19 in Addison, Ceasario had a particularly impressive tournament. In her second event of the season for Judson she placed fifth out of 310 bowlers with a total score of 1073, an average of 214.6.

Between the team games reflected above (bowling all 10 frames) and Baker games (five players each bowl two frames), Ceasario struck 50% of the time and hit the pocket 66% of the time. It helped Judson move up four places to 11th in United States Bowling Congress collegiate rankings. St. Xavier is No. 6.

"Adding Karlea has been pretty amazing," Biondo said. "She's a great player and a great person, same as Kaylee."

Depending on where the top teams are sent for the college sectionals in March, and Stardust is a distinct possibility, Judson and St. Xavier both have the Feb. 15-16 Hoosier Classic in Indianapolis on their schedules — perhaps one final spin together for Mann, Darrow and Ceasario.

On senior night, Josh Hibbett gets Larkin back to .500 mark. He hopes there's more to come. 'It's just a long road.'

Senior guard Josh Hibbett is keenly aware of the history of Larkin's boys basketball program.

During his time with the varsity, he has set out to help put the Royals on a trajectory toward where he believes things should be.

"The main goal is to go out there and just play hard and try to get this program back to what it was in the past," Hibbett said. "We know. We're usually one of the best teams in the conference."

Hibbett used Friday's senior night to get Larkin back to the .500 mark, a fence post that he knows the younger players need to see in order to keep things moving forward after he graduates.

One of three seniors for the Royals, Hibbett scored a game-high 19 points to lead his team to a 59-41 Upstate Eight Conference victory over South Elgin in Elgin.

Fellow senior guard Landon Kilberts took advantage of extra playing time to score a career-high 16 points for Larkin (10-10, 7-2), including shooting 4 of 5 from 3-point range.

Junior forward Lawrence Sallis also grabbed 13 rebounds for the Royals. Aman Chiluka scored nine points off the bench to lead South Elgin (7-16, 4-4). Kyle Mann added eight points.

Larkin coach Deryn Carter, who once played for the Royals, is big on making sure his players understand the program's tradition. Hibbett, in particular, has taken it to heart.

"He's working hard," Carter said. "He's helping us hopefully move in the right direction. We've been talking to the guys. We think we're on the right path. It's just a long road."

Carter has always been impressed with the skills of Hibbett, who started to get some playing time as a sophomore. Hibbett wasn't satisfied, so he put in the work to become a starter as a junior.

Now, he's one of the team's leaders.

"Just super talented, super athletic," Carter said. "He's taken strides. He's one of those guys when he's 21 or 22 years old, he's going to be able to play wherever he wants to play.

"He's just so athletic and so physical once he gets into his own body."

It took Hibbett a bit to get going Friday night. He missed his first four baskets and Larkin only led 22-19 in the middle of the second quarter.

But then he scored nine points in that quarter to boost the Royals to a 30-19 halftime lead.

"I couldn't even make a basket," Hibbett said. "I was just trying to let the game come to me, take some easy shots and go from there."

By the time South Elgin scored its first point of the second half on a free throw with 1:20 left, a one-possession deficit had ballooned to 40-20.

"They're physical and they're one-through-five physical," South Elgin coach Ryan Storm said. "They're doing all their things and we really struggled with the physicality.

"When they get in that rhythm where they get a couple stops and they get out in transition for easy baskets, they're hard to slow down. It started to get away from us and we were chasing."

Finishing strong, with a winning record, is part of the legacy Hibbett wants to leave behind.

"It's important to set an example," Hibbett said of the underclassmen watching him. "Being near the top of the conference this year after being one of the worst teams in the conference last season, I think it means that we can get better soon.

"I've never had a winning season here. It's my final year to have a good season, be a good team. That's what I've been working for this whole time."

Hibbett is one of those players Carter feels has his best basketball ahead of him. The new rules that don't count seasons in junior college against four-year eligibility could work to his advantage.

"It's such an unbelievable opportunity," Carter said. "We'll see. He has some interest. We'll see what comes of it."
