Elgin Area School District U-46 celebrated 30 seniors during the annual Superintendent's Scholarship reception and awards ceremony.

These members of the Class of 2025 are first-generation college-bound students, and each will receive a \$2,000 scholarship from the U-46 Educational Foundation.

"These impressive students and their families understand the transformative power of education. Through their hard work and dedication, the students are ready to take on their next challenge," said Superintendent Dr. Suzanne Johnson. "It's important to not only celebrate our Superintendent's Scholarship recipients but also to remind them of all the people who believe in them here in U-46. These students have bright futures ahead."

The students, who are spotlighted in a video on the district's YouTube channel, will graduate this month from the district's five comprehensive high schools: Bartlett, Elgin, Larkin, South Elgin and Streamwood. They attended a reception on April 23 along with their families, principals, U-46 administrators and board of education members, and members of the U-46 Educational Foundation's board.

Since the Superintendent's Scholarship fund was established in 2012 through the U-46 Educational Foundation, approximately 340 U-46 graduates, including this year's recipients, have been honored.

This year's scholarships were funded by a grant from the Seigle Foundation and donors including KCT Credit Union, Studio GC, the Association of Elgin School Administrators, John B. Sanfilippo & Son Inc., and K12 Insight.

Eligible seniors submitted applications for the scholarship this past winter. Each submitted application included the student's high school transcript, a letter of recommendation, and a personal essay.

A panel of judges reviewed nearly 100 applications. The selected 30 students are bound for post-secondary institutions including Northwestern University, Stanford University, the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, the University of Illinois Chicago, University of Wisconsin, Case Western Reserve University, Aurora University, and DePaul University.

During the scholarship reception, held at the U-46 Welcome Center, the students were encouraged to visit with administrators and supporters of the U-46 Educational Foundation to start establishing their professional network.

A week earlier, the students participated in a workshop led by Matthew Punnoose, a member of the U-46 Educational Foundation's board, and Jason Pierce, an alumnus of Bartlett High School who now works at Google. They instructed the students in the importance of building a strong personal and professional network, and guided the scholarship winners through setting up a LinkedIn profile.



The wins keep piling up for the South Elgin softball team.

Coach Brad Reynard's squad started the week winners of 11 straight and 16 of its last 17 to sit at 21-4 overall and a perfect 13-0 in Upstate Eight action.

Key reasons for the hot streak include Anna Kiel (.550 hitting, 18 RBI, 10-3, 0.81 ERA, 118 K in 69 innings), Chloe Ricard (.417 hitting, 10 doubles, 2 homers, 18 RBI), Addison Tinnerella (.431 hitting, 11 RBI, 25 runs), Emma Bell (.421, 32 hits, 18 RBI) and Jenna Sheehan (.405, 8 doubles, 6 triples, 28 RBI, 5-1 with 64 K in 47 innings). "Anna and Jenna have been doing great both at the dish and in the circle and Chole offensively has been awesome and is great working with our staff," Reynard said.

Bartlett update: Christina Stankus (10-8, 116 K in 107 innings, .397 hitting, 4 homers, 21 RBI, 24 steals) recently passed the 500 strikeout mark for her Bartlett career. Hannah Phillips (.453 hitting), Suzie Piaskowski (.388, 4 homers, 24 RBI), Emma Engels (.362, 3 homers, 17 RBI, 23 runs) and Addie Moore (.333, 16 RBI) also have helped the Hawks (13-9, 11-4 Upstate Eight), who had a recent big league win over Riverside-Brookfield.

On a North Carolina college tour, South Elgin's Adriana Jimenez finds next home. 'Been a staple for three years.'

Go your own way.

South Elgin senior Adriana Jimenez is doing just that in high school, despite having followed in the footsteps of older sister Sammy by competing in both softball and cheerleading.

"She's had a nice career and been a staple for three years now," Storm coach Brad Reynard said of Adriana. "I've been fortunate to have her play both third base and catcher for me.

"Sammy probably caught a bit more than Adriana, but both have the same skill sets — cannons for arms, hit for power."

Jimenez didn't flex that power Monday for host South Elgin in a 6-2 Upstate Eight Conference win over West Aurora, but she did execute a sacrifice bunt with two runners on to key a four-run first inning that was all the support senior pitcher Anna Kiel needed.

Kiel and sophomore first baseman Jenna Sheehan produced RBI doubles and senior second baseman Amber Gnutek added a two-run single for the Storm (22-4, 14-0), who are staging a strong defense of last year's conference title.

South Elgin owns a two-game lead over Riverside-Brookfield, Reynard's alma mater, with four left to play.

"We like where we're at," Reynard said.





Kiel (10-3), a Loyola recruit, is swinging a hot bat. She went 3-for-3 to lift her average to .571 and checked the Blackhawks (14-14, 11-5) on three hits with nine strikeouts.

West Aurora (14-14, 11-5) was held scoreless until the seventh when Ohio State-bound senior shortstop Sara Tarr drew a two-out walk and came home on a triple by senior outfielder Keira Hayton, a Missouri-St. Louis commit. Hayton scored on a single by sophomore outfielder Gracie Del Toro.

Jimenez, meanwhile, did much of the research and legwork before signing with Gaston, a Division I junior college in Dallas, North Carolina, a suburb of Charlotte. She's three years younger than Sammy, who's playing at NCAA Division II Tusculum in Greeneville, Tennessee.

"I was on a search of schools and was interested in Belmont Abbey," Jimenz said of the NCAA Division II program, also in the Charlotte area. "I went there for a camp and decided to tour a lot of the schools in the area. I found it, met the coach and loved it and thought it was for me."

Jimenez, who also plays shortstop as well as third base and catcher for her travel team, continued to send Gaston coach Michael Steuerwald video and eventually received an offer.

Gaston's program is in its third season and recently qualified for its second NJCAA World Series by winning region and district titles.

Jimenez, who is hitting .319 with seven doubles and two home runs, is second on team for South Elgin with 26 RBIs. She hit .383 last season and earned all-conference honors. She has been a member of Storm competitive cheerleading teams that won one state title and placed third twice.

"Hopefully, we can do the same," Reynard said.

Last season, the Storm lost 2-1 in nine innings to Lake Park in a regional final and to the same Lancers 6-3 in a sectional final the previous season.

"I have confidence we'll make it further in the playoffs than we have," Adriana said. "I feel like this team, we like to have fun. In the past, it's been a little bit more businesslike.

"This team, it's more like we trust each other and we want to have fun all the time. Maybe we put more pressure on ourselves. This dynamic is different than any other year."

Reynard is enjoying the ride.

"Having seven years of Jimenz helping our program out has been a blessing," he said. "I joke with her parents (Oscar and Renee) about it. Next year, what am I gonna do now at third base?"

South Elgin has quietly been putting together an outstanding softball season. The Storm won their 13th straight game with an 8-4 victory Tuesday against Larkin on Elgin's West Side.

Led by 7 seniors, the Storm is 23-4 overall and 16-0 in the Upstate Eight Conference.

Storm coach Brad Reynard cited the senior battery of pitcher Anna Kiel and catcher Chloe Ricard as leading the way for the Storm. Second pitcher Jenna Sheehan, who started Tuesday, has also contributed.

The Storm will honor Kiel, Ricard, Lexi Genz, Amber Gnutek, Adriana Jimenez, Grace Krabbe, and Addison Tinarella when they host Glenbard South Thursday on senior night.

A couple of seniors were in the spotlight Tuesday. Kiel broke the school record with her 150th hit in the seventh inning. Her teammates held up a banner in honor of the achievement. Kiel also holds the school records for doubles and strikeouts.

One batter after Kiel's hit, Jimenez, who got the start behind the plate, provided some much-needed insurance by depositing a 2-run homer over the right-field fence.

Kiel wasn't even supposed to play Tuesday. But when Sheehan's pitch count began to rise, Kiel entered the circle to start the fifth inning. She pitched 3 scoreless innings for the save. She set the hits record with a grounder up the middle leading off the seventh.

"We were hoping she'd [get the hit record] on Thursday which is our senior day, but that's how things work out," said Reynard.

"I didn't even know," Kiel said. "They surprised me. I had no clue."

The Storm jumped ahead 5-1 Tuesday, with Kaidence Rumachik providing a pair of run-scoring doubles.

Ali Herrick kept the Royals in it with a 3-run shot to right in the third, but Sheehan and Kiel restored order after that.

An RBI double by Sheehan and Jimenez's shot provided some insurance, which came in handy when the Royals brought the tying run to the plate in the seventh. Larkin loaded the bases on a walk, a hit batter, and an error, but Kiel reared back and got 2 strikeouts to end it.

"Just overcoming adversity is a feather in their cap," Reynard said. "It wasn't pretty at times, but our girls did enough to go ahead and win. It's always a game with them here. We've got to bring it from here on out."

Kiel said picking each other up is nothing new for the Storm citing team chemistry as the key to the Storm's success this year.

"When everyone's on I feel like everyone really is on," she said. "Everyone is supporting everyone. The team dynamic is working really well."

'Edgy' Tim: South Elgin's Mueller set to make college decision

South Elgin High School junior tight end Gavin Mueller (6-foot-6, 255 pounds), a four-star-ranked recruit by Rivals.com, wrapped up his final planned official visit last weekend at Louisiana State University, and remains on target to announce his college decision.

The announcement will take place at 3:20 p.m. Wednesday in the school's library.

Mueller, also a standout basketball player, played his first season of high school football last fall while attending St. Francis. He's narrowed his final list to Colorado. Wisconsin, LSU and Notre Dame.

Mueller made official visits to all four except Notre Dame.

West Aurora junior quarterback Mason Atkins (6-foot-3, 190 pounds) gave his verbal commitment last week to Ball State University.

"I've been able to build up a really strong relationship and a connection with the Ball State coaches and it was time for me to make my decision," Atkins said. "Ball State made me feel wanted and it's a place where I feel I can succeed so I gave them my commitment."

Atkins pointed to a few key factors in making his commitment.

"The relationship I have with Ball State coaches, including (head coach Mike Uremovich) along with (offensive coordinator Craig Harmon) and the overall connection we have was really an important factor in my decision," he said. "The Ball State staff really believe in me.

"Iowa was a school that early on seemed to be pretty interested in me, but they wanted to wait on offering me and wanted to see me in a camp this summer," he said. "I also looked into several other (Mid-American Conference) schools like NIU and also Buffalo. In the end I just felt like I was ready to make my decision, and why wait on other schools to offer me? I also did not want to wait and pass up a great opportunity waiting for me at Ball State. A lot of schools at all levels wanted to see me in camps this summer but I was ready to make my decision and didn't want to wait any longer."

With his college decision behind him. Atkins can now focus on his summer and gearing up for the 2025 season without having to focus on recruiting.

"I would say the hardest part of the process for me was just how wild it can get with quarterback recruiting," he said. "Offers seem to get picked up really fast and it's always changing. Just the overall timing with recruiting really is important and it worked out for me in the end."

Rolling Meadows junior tight end Sean Kerr (6-foot-5, 215 pounds) has continued to see his recruiting stock steadily rise this spring.

"I've been able to add new offers recently from both Bryant and UMass," Kerr said. "My recruiting has definitely picked up over the last few weeks and we are expecting more college coaches to stop into school over the next few weeks.

"Besides Bryant and UMass I've also been in contact with the coaches from Indiana State, San Diego State along with South Dakota State and also South Dakota," he said. "Holy Cross is supposed to be in school soon and also Columbia has been starting to show more interest. The feedback from the college coaches has been good and they all want to see me in a one day camp this summer and see what I can do in person."

2026 TE Gavin Mueller on Colorado official visit South Elgin (Ill.) three-star tight end Gavin Mueller has committed to Colorado, he announced on Wednesday.

He chose the Buffaloes over LSU, Notre Dame and Wisconsin.

Mueller is the No. 516 overall prospect and No. 22 TE in the 2026 cycle, according to the On3 Industry Ranking, a weighted average that utilizes all four major recruiting media companies. He's also the No. 14 player in Illinois.

The 6-foot-6, 231-pounder becomes the second pledge for head coach Deion Sanders and the Buffs this cycle. Last month, Calabasas (Calif.) EDGE Domata Peko Jr., the son of CU coach Domata Peko, announced his commitment.

Mueller, who also excels in track and field via the shot put, took his official visit to Boulder on the first weekend of May. Colorado receivers coach Brett Bartolone helped lead the Big 12 program's push for the tight end.

Colorado Buffaloes Land 4-Star Recruit Gavin Mueller's Commitment Over LSU

The Colorado Buffaloes landed four-star tight end recruit Gavin Mueller's commitment over the LSU Tigers, Wisconsin Badgers and Notre Dame Fighting Irish. Coach Deion Sanders and the Buffs now have two class of 2026 commitments, and more are likely coming soon.

Gavin Mueller, a class of 2026 four-star tight end from South Elgin, Illinois, gave his commitment to coach Deion Sanders and the Colorado Buffaloes on Wednesday afternoon.

Just over two weeks after earning three-star EDGE Domata Peko Jr.'s pledge, Mueller becomes Colorado's second class of 2026 commit. 247Sports, Rivals and On3 all predicted Mueller to land with the Buffs, but the LSU Tigers, Wisconsin Badgers and Notre Dame Fighting Irish were also in the running.

Listed at 6-foot-5 and 255 pounds, Mueller visited Boulder on May 2 and was in Baton Rouge last Friday. He announced his college commitment live on 247Sports' YouTube channel.

"Colorado is the next generation of football," Mueller told 247Sports. "I think there's a lot of opportunity. Most of all, it seems like a brotherhood there. All the guys are very interested in me and my journey, and it seems like they genuinely want me to be there. The coaches made me a priority, and the fans have reached out and shown non-stop support. I'm very excited to get to know all of them."

Mueller is a three-star prospect according to 247Sports and On3 but is considered a four-star by Rivals. The 247Sports composite ranks Mueller as the No. 42 tight end in his class and the No. 18 prospect in Illinois while Rivals pegs him as the No. 23 tight end.

247Sports national analyst Hudson Standish believes Mueller holds great athleticism and has the potential to become an elite college tight end.

Profiles as an in-line Y tight end at the next level who can use his physicality at the LOS (line of scrimmage) to create running lanes and his frame to box out defenders at the first two levels. Has shown the ability to make plays at the catch point and excels at tracking the football in crowded conditions. Played through a shoulder injury and underwent surgery following his first season of football, should be viewed as a high-upside attached tight end who could blossom into a key piece for a College Football Playoff contender.

"I get my athleticism from basketball, and then I kind of get my blocking and my hitting people from lifting weights and loving that," Mueller told 247Sports. "I think the best part about me is being able to do a little bit of both."

Colorado tight ends coach Brett Bartolone made Mueller a high priority in recent days, visiting with the prospect before, during and after his official visit to Boulder.

Mueller shared that he has only been playing football for about one year.

"The path was a little bit more sped up than anyone else," Mueller told 247Sports. "Almost a year ago today, I didn't even know I was playing football. To make this many strides and get this far in the year has been it's been a blessing, so I'm very grateful for everything."

Other class of 2026 recruits Colorado is trending well with include five-star wide receiver Cederian Morgan, four-star wide receiver Jase Mathews, four-star linebacker Duyon Forkpa Jr. and four-star offensive linemen G'nivre Carr and Deacon Schmitt.

With Peko and Mueller being the only commits, Colorado's 2026 recruiting class ranks No. 88 nationally, according to 247Sports.
