In U-46, we have 45 school counselors in our middle and high schools. We thank them for the work they do in supporting our students' academic, social, and emotional growth.



High School Early Release Day



Next Wednesday, Feb. 12, is an early release day for students in our five comprehensive high schools — Bartlett, Elgin, Larkin, South Elgin, and Streamwood. High schoolers will be dismissed at 1:59 p.m. to allow teachers time for planning and collaboration.

Please note that this schedule change does not apply to

elementary or middle school students as well as Dream Academy and Central School students – they will follow their regular dismissal times.

High school students who rely on bus transportation or participate in after-school activities are expected to remain at school until the regular dismissal time of 2:55 p.m. They will be supervised during this period. Students may use this time to complete homework, study, or explore other options offered in the building.

Safety Tuesday on Wednesday

U-46 is fully committed to providing a safe and secure learning environment for all students, and that includes online.

U-46 uses a digital safety service, called Securly, on the Chromebooks and iPads provided to students. The service alerts U-46 staff if there is activity that indicates a student may be considering self-harm, harming others, or be involved in cyberbullying. More information about Securly, including an option for parents, can be found here.



Of course, most students have online access on devices other than the ones provided by U-46. Tuesday, Feb. 11, is <u>Safer Internet Day</u>, an international education and awareness-raising effort designed to promote safer and more responsible use of online technology and mobile phones.

Parents should supervise their children's internet use, periodically checking their profiles, games, apps, and social media sites they visit.

The National PTA has a <u>number of resources</u> designed to empower families to use technology safely - and to inspire conversations between parents and children about guidelines for screen time, appropriate content, and online interactions. A Family Media Agreement, such as <u>this one</u> offered by Common Sense Media, can also help guide conversations about digital safety.

Exploring Cell Phone Limits in School



The focus for this month's meeting of the Community Advisory Council will be "Exploring Cell Phone Limits in School." The meeting is being held in person on Thursday, Feb. 13, at 7 p.m. at the U-46 Welcome Center, 1019 E. Chicago St., Elgin. It will feature a presentation by two U-46 principals - one from a middle school, one from a high school - whose schools piloted updated

procedures limiting student use of cell phones during the school day. A panel discussion to follow will include students and teachers discussing their experiences with the new procedures. All are welcome to attend CAC meetings, and Spanish-language interpretation will be available.

African American Advisory Council
