Exploring Cell Phone Limits in School





procedures limiting student use of cell phones during the school day. A panel discussion to follow


will include students and teachers discussing their experiences with the new procedures. All are welcome to attend CAC meetings, and Spanish-language interpretation will be available.

Planetarium Sky Show



- All player jerseys, including the mascot's, will be auctioned during the game.


