Safety Tuesday on Wednesday



March is recognized as <u>Severe Weather Preparedness Month</u> in Illinois, and while severe weather can happen at any time of the year, this is a good time to review your own family's preparedness efforts. The Illinois Emergency Management Agency advises that including your children in the planning process and answering their questions about safety can help them feel more comfortable and safe.

Children should know their basic contact information, how to use a telephone and cell phone, how and when to call 9-1-1, and the details of a family evacuation plan.

In addition, having a <u>Family Communications Plan</u> can help you map locations to meet and track important contact information. More emergency communication tips are available <u>here</u>.

The change to Daylight Savings Time - this year happening on Sunday, March 9 - is also a great time to test your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms and change the batteries if needed.

U-46 prepares for emergencies by testing its phones and silent alarm systems on the first Tuesday of each month, coinciding with the tests of emergency sirens conducted by our local communities. Each school in U-46 holds a number of safety drills each school year, including drills to help prepare students and staff in the case of a fire, severe weather, or the need to evacuate a school bus. Summer Connection

Enrollment for Summer Connection programs will open on Monday, March 10. A full description of what is being offered can be found at <u>u-46.org/summerconnection</u>. Here are two new opportunities to note:

Kindergarten Camps: This year we will be hosting a pilot Kindergarten Camp in 10 of our elementary schools for our incoming kindergarteners. **Students who will attend the following schools will have the opportunity to participate:** Bartlett Elementary, Century Oaks, Channing,

Horizon, Parkwood, Washington, Sunnydale, Fox Meadow, McKinley, and Ontarioville. The camp will be held for two days in July, from 8 a.m. to noon. This camp, which is free, will give students the opportunity to make new friends, meet school staff, become familiar with school routines, and build excitement for the start of the school year. Dual Language Program



There are two Dual Language informational meetings left this year for parents and guardians of incoming kindergarten and 1st grade students. The next one will be held Monday, March 10, at 6:30 p.m. at the Gail Borden Public Library, 270 N. Grove Ave., Elgin.

These sessions will outline how learning takes place in a Dual Language classroom, the benefits for students who learn in a bilingual setting, and the next steps for families who are interested. By attending a meeting, you are not obligated to sign

High School Early Release

Next Wednesday, March 12, is an early release day for students in our five comprehensive high schools — Bartlett, Elgin, Larkin, South Elgin, and Streamwood. High schoolers will be dismissed at 1:59 p.m. to allow teachers time for planning and collaboration.



Please note that this schedule change does not apply to elementary

or middle school students as well as Dream Academy and Central School students -- they will follow their regular dismissal times.

High school students who rely on bus transportation or participate in after-school activities are expected to remain at school until the regular dismissal time of 2:55 p.m. They will be supervised during this period. Students may use this time to complete homework, study, or explore other options offered in the building.
