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

School District U-46 will be part of a presentation this month designed to provide parents and guardians with tools to discuss marijuana use with their teens. This will be an educational event with the goal to inform parents and empower them to have conversations with the young people in their lives. P.E.P. Talk Parent University, with P.E.P. standing for Prepare, Educate,

Prevent, is being offered at 6:30 p.m. on Monday, April 21, at the Gail Borden Public Library, 270 N. Grove Ave., Elgin, in the Meadows Community Room. Other organizations collaborating on the event are Coalition for a Safe and Healthy Elgin, the Gretchen S. Vapnar Community Crisis Center, and Ecker Center for Behavioral Health. The P.E.P. Talk is free to the public and will include Spanish interpretation. Children ages 4 and under may attend with their parents. Children ages 11 and older can visit the library while their parents attend the presentation, as the material covered is sensitive in nature. 5K Walk for Autism Acceptance

U-46's Instructional Learning Program, known as ILP, supports students in grades kindergarten through 12th grade where many of our students are on the Autism Spectrum. The program serves students with moderate to severe Autism and is structured to support their communication, sensory, independent functioning and social-emotional needs. For the last five years, teachers and staff members who work in the program have organized the 5K Walk for Autism Acceptance. This year, they've partnered with the U-46 Educational Foundation so that U-46 ILP teachers can request to use donated funds that will directly impact their students.

The 5K is scheduled for Saturday, April 26, at 9:30 a.m. at Centennial Elementary School in Bartlett.
