Winter Recess

Students are in class through Friday, Dec. 20. Winter recess begins Monday, Dec. 23, and will last through Friday, Jan. 3. As we approach winter recess, we ask that families ensure their children attend school every day. <u>Every Minute Matters</u> in maintaining the excitement for learning and classroom activities. Research shows that missing just nine days of school can significantly impact a student's learning, potentially leading to falling behind in their work or declining grades.



We'll be glad to see our students back in the classroom in 2025 - the first day of classes after recess will be Monday, Jan. 6. Find calendars for this school year as well as 2025-26 at <u>u-46.org/calendar</u>.

Snow Days and Dressing for Winter

U-46 families are encouraged to ensure their children are dressed appropriately for the winter weather before leaving the house each morning. This includes a winter jacket, hat, gloves, scarf, and snow boots when there's snow on the ground.

School leaders have discretion in deciding whether students will be outdoors or indoors for recess and/or physical education. Schools are provided with <u>guidelines</u>, including ensuring that students

are not outside when the temperature or wind chill falls below 10 degrees.

Sometimes, U-46 must close schools due to inclement weather. When inclement weather is underway or expected, Superintendent Dr. Suzanne Johnson is in regular contact with our Transportation and Plant Operations teams for updates. Information is also gathered from the State of Illinois, authorities in our three counties (Kane, Cook and DuPage), local police and colleagues in

With that input, the Superintendent makes the decision on the status of schools, if possible, by 5:15 a.m. If classes are canceled for the entire day due to inclement weather, the District will send out a mass notification phone call, email, and text message to all parents and staff by 5:45 a.m. When the regular school day is canceled, all before and after-school activities are canceled as well.

Closings will also be posted on the District website at <u>u-46.org</u>, and posted on the District's social media channels.
