

A reminder on preparing for winter weather

The month of January has certainly reminded all who live in northern Illinois about the challenges posed by snow, ice, and frigid temperatures, and there's a long time ahead before winter weather ends.

So we wanted to explain to U-46 families our weather policies for outdoor recess and physical education, which seek to balance the importance of time outdoors with safety precautions.



School leaders have the discretion in deciding whether students will be outdoors or indoors for recess and/or physical education. Schools are provided with <u>guidelines</u>, including ensuring that students are not outside when the temperature or wind chill falls below 10 degrees.

U-46 families are encouraged to ensure their children are dressed appropriately for the winter weather before leaving the house each morning. This includes a winter jacket, hat, gloves, scarf, and snow boots when there's snow on the ground.

2023-24 school year calendar updated

This month's extreme winter weather caused U-46 to use two of its allotted five emergency days. Classes were canceled for students on Friday, Jan. 12, and Tuesday, Jan. 16.

As a result, the 2023-24 school year will be extended by two days. If no other emergency days are used, the last day of classes for U-46 students will be Thursday, May 30.
