2023-24 School Calendar

We have adjusted this year's school calendar to make up for the three emergency days U-46 had to use in January due to weather conditions.

Initially, Friday, May 3, 2024, was scheduled as an Institute Day, but this day will now be a regular student attendance day. The Institute Day has been moved to Friday, May 31. The last day of the school year for students will be Thursday, May 30, 2024, if no additional emergency days are used.

Also, a reminder - this Friday, March 1, is an Institute Day. Students will not have classes on Friday, March 1, but U-46 offices will be open.

Summer Connection

School District U-46 is excited to be able to offer another year of rewarding and enriching summer programs, which are all grouped under the name of Summer Connection.

An important note: There will be no free summer programs offered through partnerships with community organizations such as park districts, YMCA, Side Street Studio Arts, or the Boy Scouts. That programming was supported by federal Covid relief funds that are no longer available for the summer partner programs. We are grateful for the organizations that partnered with us over the past few summers to offer these unique opportunities to our families.

However, we will be offering an enrichment-focused summer school for select elementary students from June 5 through July 3 at five elementary buildings. A new elementary Summer Connection program for students newly arrived in the United States will offer language development, cultural orientation, and academic preparation.



At the secondary level, summer school will be open to all, although spots are limited. Also, there will be special, voluntary, two-day programs for students transitioning to 7th grade (Middle School Experience,) 9th grade (Freshman Connection), or senior year (College Jumpstart). The Extended School Year program will be offered to students in Special Education. Students who are part of Brothers Rise Up, I Am LEAD and gifted programs will also have summer opportunities.

Enrollment is not yet open for any of these programs, but details will be shared with U-46 families through our U-46 Engage newsletter and direct messages. Stay tuned!



If you have a child who will be entering kindergarten, 6th grade, 9th grade, or 12th grade next school year, the state of Illinois has certain health requirements for those students. For incoming seniors, that means proving they are up to date on their meningococcal vaccine. For students in the other listed grades, physical exams and certain immunizations are required.

You can find details on the requirements, as well as the necessary forms, in English and Spanish [on this page](#), in the Health Services section of the U-46 website. Forms are due on or before Aug. 13. Note that secondary students won't receive their schedules until all health requirements are turned in.

Because of these required physicals, summers are always busy at the offices of pediatricians. Please schedule your doctor's appointments now! Families who have questions or need assistance locating a clinic for a physical or immunization should contact the nurse at their school.
