#### **No Classes**

Here are a couple of important calendar reminders: Tuesday, March 19, is Election Day, and many U-46 buildings are used as polling places. Therefore, there will be no classes for students on March 19, although U-46 offices will be open.

Then, the spring recess will begin on Monday, March 25 and last through Monday, April 1. We'll welcome our students back to classrooms on Tuesday, April 2.



It's very important that students attend classes on Monday, March 18, and the rest of the week after Election Day. In fact, it's important that students are in school and on time to class every day, right up until the end of the school year. Regular attendance is an important factor in student achievement. ## **COVID Guidance**

On Tuesday, March 5, 2024, the Illinois Department of Public Health issued updated guidance that mirrors what the CDC issued on March 1, 2024. These changes are now being implemented.

U-46 students and staff who test positive for COVID-19 are no longer excluded from school or work for a preset amount of time. Instead, a student or staff member can return to school/work once they have been fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication) and have overall symptom improvement. # **Student Equity and Inclusion Survey**

### **#U46Eclipse**

There's less than a month until the solar eclipse on Monday, April 8, and U-46's Office of K-12 Science & Planetarium is busy preparing so that students and staff can safely view and appreciate this special event.

Information can be found at <u>u-46.org/eclipse</u> on the distribution schedule for eclipse glasses/viewers, the permission slips that parents/guardians will need to sign starting March 18, and eclipsefocused public sky shows at the Planetarium. There is also a series



of weekly, 1-minute videos that focus on topics such as how the 2024 eclipse will be different than one in 2017, the ways you can safely watch the eclipse, and more.

U-46's radio station, WEPS 88.9 FM, is also broadcasting an hour-long radio program in which Planetarium teachers Peggy Hernandez and Joe Kellenberger discuss the eclipse. The recorded program will air at 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on the following dates: March 19, March 25, March 28, April 1, April 3, and April 5. We hope you tune in and tell others, too!
