Solar Eclipse

The solar eclipse is less than a week away! Parents and guardians who want their child to go outside and view the eclipse on April 8 must sign a permission slip - either the online version here, or by downloading and signing this paper copy to return to the school.

Students whose parents have signed the permission slip - and whose teacher has completed the necessary professional development - will be provided eclipse glasses or an eclipse viewer in class on Monday morning.



U-46's K-12 Science and Planetarium Department has been preparing for this event for more than a year. This eclipse is an amazing learning opportunity for our students, which is why we're providing the necessary scientific tool - and the proper training - so we can all enjoy this celestial event safely.

Remember, it's never safe to look directly at the Sun without the appropriate eye protection, and the Sun isn't doing anything different during an eclipse than it does on a regular day.

U-46's Summer Connection program for elementary students is now open to all current kindergarten through 5th grade students, but there are limited spots available! (It is also open to incoming kindergarten students who are currently enrolled in a U-46 preschool.)

This free academic program, focusing on literacy, mathematics, art, music, and wellness, will take place from 8 a.m. to noon Monday through Friday starting June 5 through July 3, 2024. (No classes

on Wednesday, June 19.)

Students will be assigned to one of the five elementary summer program sites based on their home address. Breakfast is included and transportation will be provided to eligible students who enroll by April 22.

Newcomer Parent Support Group

Is your family new to the United States? Then we hope you can attend the next session of our Newcomer Parent Support Group on Wednesday, April 17, at 6 p.m. at the U-46 Welcome Center, 1019 E. Chicago St., Elgin.

Those who attend this session will learn more about the registration process for the 2024-25 school year and services offered by our <u>Project Access</u> department, as well as social-emotional support strategies for adults and children. Community resources will be available, and childcare will be provided.

The sessions will be interpreted in Gujarati, Hindi, Panjabi, Polish, Portuguese, Spanish, Russian, Ukrainian, and Urdu. Those families that do not speak these languages are also welcome to attend as we will offer an alternative way for them to engage in the program.



These sessions are tailor-made to support and empower Newcomer families, providing them with the knowledge and skills to enhance their children's academic journeys. They are being organized by the Multilingual and Multicultural Education Department, and questions can be directed through Let's Talk.

Online registration for the 2024-25 school year is now open to all families who have a child or children in any grade from preschool through 12th grade. By registering this spring, you can help the District better plan for staffing and transportation for next school year and help ensure our schools are ready to welcome students on the first day back.

IMPORTANT NOTE: All currently enrolled students must be registered by May 31 or else wait for late registration to open in the summer.

No instructional fees are being collected; the District is covering the cost of instructional materials fees for the 2024-25 school year.
