High School Standardized Testing

The schedule for most of U-46's high schoolers will look different on Wednesday, Oct. 11. On that day, freshmen will take the PSAT 8/9 and sophomores and juniors will take the PSAT/NMSQT. The assessments will provide students with feedback (through their College Board accounts) regarding areas of strength and growth as they prepare for the required SAT test in the spring of their junior year. Freshmen, sophomores, and juniors should bring their fully-charged Chromebook to school on Oct. 11.

Because of the testing, seniors will not attend school in person on Oct. 11 and are instead expected to participate in the virtual Post Secondary Fair.

Students in specific special education programs — including Instructional Learning Program (ILP), Modified Learning Program (MLP), Exceptional Needs (EN1, EN2), and Transition — will have a regular school day on Oct. 11.

Dual Credit Info Nights

U-46 partners with Elgin Community College (ECC) to offer a <u>Dual Credit program</u> for our high school juniors and seniors. The full-time Dual Credit program provides students the opportunity to take all of their coursework at ECC while earning both high school and college credit for all of their courses. Current sophomores and juniors are eligible to apply to the Dual Credit program for the 2024-25 school year.



Interested parents and students are encouraged to attend one of the Dual Credit informational nights, both virtual and starting at 6 p.m., on Tuesday, Oct. 17 (join Zoom here) or Thursday, Oct. 26 (join Zoom here.)
