High School Magnet Academy Applications

As of today, 8th grade students are now able to apply for admission to one of U-46's Magnet Academies, located at our five comprehensive high schools. The application window will stay open through Oct. 31.

To help students and their families better understand the focus of the academies, all five high schools are hosting information sessions, and the first two are next week: On Tuesday, Oct. 10, at Larkin High School's <u>Visual and Performing Arts Magnet Academy</u>, and on Wednesday, Oct. 11 at Bartlett High School's <u>Science, Engineering, and High Technology Magnet Academy</u>. Current sophomores and juniors are eligible to apply to attend the full-time <u>Dual Credit</u> program for the 2024-25 school year. This allows students to attend Elgin Community College, where they earn both high school and college credit for their courses. It can also save students thousands of dollars in college costs.
