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

## **National Bus Safety Week**

<u>National School Bus Safety Week</u> is Oct. 16-20 this year. School bus drivers do everything they can to keep students safe, but drivers and parents play a critical role, too. By following the bus safety laws and guidelines, we can all help protect the children who ride school buses in our communities. Violating school bus safety laws in Illinois can result in a fine, citation, or loss of driver's license. When driving near our school buses, please remember the following guidelines.

#### **Stop for School Buses**

If you are traveling behind a school bus, be sure to follow at a safe distance, because the vehicles make frequent stops. When you see a school bus slowing down or stopping, be aware of not only the bus but also the surrounding area. Children are likely nearby.

#### **Illegal School Bus Passing**

In Illinois, it is illegal for you to pass a school bus while the stop-arm is extended and the red lights are flashing. This applies to highways, streets, private roads, and school property, including when school buses are in parking lots or in a drop-off or pick-up lane at school. The Illinois State Police offer more information here.

#### **Understanding School Bus Lights**

Yellow flashing lights indicate the bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children. You should slow down and prepare to stop your vehicle. Red flashing lights and extended stop arms indicate the bus has stopped and children are getting on or off.

### **Dual Credit Info Session**

Parents, guardians, and students who want to learn more about U-46's full-time <u>Dual Credit</u> <u>program</u> should plan to attend an informational session on Thursday, Oct. 26, at 6 p.m. It's being held via Zoom and can be joined <u>here</u>. Spanish-language interpretation will be available.

The full-time Dual Credit program provides U-46 students the opportunity to take all of their coursework at Elgin Community College (ECC) while earning both high school and college credit for their courses. Current sophomores and juniors are eligible to apply to the Dual Credit program for the 2024-25 school year.

## **STEM Expo Kick-Off**

Students who are fascinated by fossils won't want to miss the STEM Expo Kick-Off event being held at 6 p.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 25, at the <u>Bartlett Public Library</u>.

The featured guest will be U-46 graduate and Bartlett native Carrie Levitt-Bussian, who serves as the paleontology collections manager at the Natural History Museum of Utah. She will share stories about her daily life and experiences as a paleontologist and bring some items to display as well. She'll be available to answer questions at the end of the session. Space is limited, so advance registration is encouraged.

## **Magnet Academy Deadline**

The application process closes at the end of this month for U-46 8th graders who are interested in attending high school at one of the District's five <u>Magnet Academies</u>. Each of the five academies has a unique focus and accompanying curriculum that promote student interest and academic excellence.



To be considered for a U-46 Magnet Academy, students are required to have a 2.0 GPA and two letters of recommendation.

For students who think they want to apply, it's important for them to allow enough time to gather their recommendation letters and resolve any questions or concerns.
