

## First School Day of 2025

We hope our U-46 students and their families are enjoying the winter recess. Our administrators, teachers, and staff will be excited to welcome students back to their classrooms on Monday, Jan. 6.

Many people like to make resolutions for the new year, and aiming for regular, <u>daily attendance</u> at school is a resolution that has long-term benefits for students. Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic growth, starting in kindergarten and continuing through high school. Every Minute Matters!



To help parents and students track their attendance, please download and print the <u>Attendance Tracker</u>, and post it on your refrigerator or bulletin board. Mark every absence to ensure your child does not exceed nine absent days.

### **High School Early Release Day**

Wednesday, Jan. 8, is an early release day for students in our five comprehensive high schools - Bartlett, Elgin, Larkin, South Elgin, and Streamwood. High schoolers will be dismissed at 1:59 p.m. to allow teachers time for planning and collaboration.



Please note that this schedule change does not apply to elementary or middle school students as well as Dream Academy and Central School students - they will follow their regular dismissal times.

High school students who rely on bus transportation or participate in after-school activities are expected to remain at school until the regular dismissal time of 2:55 p.m. They will be supervised during this period. Students may use this time to complete homework, study, or explore other options offered in the building.
