### Developing A Stronger Relationship with your Adolescent

The next meeting of the <u>Bilingual Parent Advisory Committee</u> (BPAC) is Wednesday, Jan. 25, at 6 p.m., with both an in-person and virtual option available. Psychologist and author Ferney Ramirez will speak about the changes adolescents experience as they get older and how parents can develop a better relationship with their tweens and teenagers.

BPAC consists of parents interested in being proactive in their child's education. A primary objective of the committee is to establish a clear and collaborative voice between families with students in the Dual Language program at our school sites and School District U-46.

The in-person meeting will be held at the Gail Borden Public Library, 270 N. Grove Ave., Elgin. Childcare will be available for children in kindergarten through 6th grade. The virtual meeting will be held via Zoom and can be joined via <a href="info.u-46.org/BPAC-22">info.u-46.org/BPAC-22</a>.

All are welcome to attend the meeting, which will be conducted in Spanish with interpretation into English available.

#### **Parent Cafes**

The U-46 Family Welcome Center hosts "Parent Cafes" regularly at schools throughout the District. During these cafes, parents have the opportunity to talk with other caregivers about the challenges and rewards of raising a family. They also learn about five "protective factors" — such as social connections and knowledge of parenting — that have been shown to keep children safe and families strong.



Through individual self-reflection and peer-to-peer learning, participants create strategies from their own wisdom and experiences to help strengthen their families. Participants leave Parent Cafes feeling inspired, energized, and excited to put into practice what they've learned!

The sessions are held in Spanish.

# Foundation Scholarship Application OPENS SOON!

The U-46 Educational Foundation manages college scholarships worth tens of thousands of dollars, thanks to the generosity of donors.



U-46 seniors can apply for most of the scholarships via the U-46 Educational Foundation Online Scholarship Application. This one online application will allow students to be considered for up to nine scholarships without having to fill out a different application for each scholarship

Some of the U-46 Educational Foundation scholarships using this application require supplemental essays or short answer questions that are unique to that scholarship. Most scholarships require letters of recommendation, and applicants must have filled out the FAFSA or the Illinois Alternative Application for Financial Aid.
