High Schools Invited to Learn More about HBCUs

U-46 high schoolers and their parents or guardians have a great chance this week to learn more about the opportunities available at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). A virtual panel being held at 6 p.m. on Thursday, Feb. 23, will feature representatives, current students, and alumni from Howard University, Tuskegee University, Grambling State University, and North Carolina A&T State University. The current students will talk about why they chose an HBCU for their post-secondary path, and the challenges and opportunities in attending college outside the Midwest. Alumni will address how their time at an HBCU prepared them for the career they're in now. Admissions representatives will detail the support and services that are available to students. In addition, there will be lots of good advice for any student participating in the college search and



The District's Black History Month celebration is being held Friday, Feb. 24, at 7 p.m., at Larkin High School. It will feature a keynote speech from Roger Simmons, an adjunct professor at Judson University who provides instruction to students about cultural diversity. He also serves as Judson's Director of Diversity and Spiritual Development, working with the university community to develop programs, policies, and practices that promote an institutional culture of diversity, equity, and inclusive excellence.

Bilingual Parent Advisory Committee to Meet

The next Bilingual Parent Advisory Committee (BPAC) meeting is Wednesday, March 1, at 6 p.m. It will be held in person at the Gail Borden Public Library, or parents and guardians can join the virtual session at info.u-46.org/BPAC-22.

During the meeting, psychologist Ferney Ramirez will address the "dark side" of social media and how parents and guardians can help their children navigate social media in a safer manner. The meeting will be conducted in Spanish. Childcare will be available at the library for children ages 5 to 10. Learn about the Bond Proposal

This spring, community members in U-46 will be asked to vote on a zero-tax-rate-change bond proposal that will address essential school building needs, expand preschool opportunities, and ensure all U-46 schools have up-to-date safety and security features. This proposal will give voters a unique chance to improve our schools, without increasing the property tax rate. As previous debt from a referendum in the early 2000s is paid off, the District can take on new debt without changing the tax rate homeowners pay. You can file
