Superintendent Search Focus Group

The U-46 Board of Education needs input from staff, students, parents, and the community in their search to appoint the next superintendent of School District U-46. An online survey and focus groups are available to gather this information as well as impressions of the District.

The executive search firm Hazard, Young, Attea, and Associates (HYA) will be holding a series of focus groups - in person and virtually. Both will have Spanish interpretation available. The virtual option hosted by the U-46 Community Advisory Council will start at 7 p.m. Thursday, April 6. Please register at https://info.u-46.org/CAC22-23. The in-person focus group at 6 p.m. Wednesday, April 12, will be held at the U-46 Welcome Center, 1019 E. Chicago Street in Elgin. No registration is required for the in-person focus group.

The online survey is open to U-46 parents, students, teachers, support staff, administrators, and community members. The anonymous and confidential survey is available in English and Spanish <u>here</u> through Friday, April 14.

Online registration for the 2023-24 school year officially opened on April 1. All families who have a child or children in any grade from preschool through 12th grade are encouraged to register as soon as possible. By registering this spring, you can help the District better plan for staffing and transportation for next school year and help ensure our schools are ready to welcome students on the first day back.

NEW THIS YEAR! All currently enrolled students must be registered no later than May 31.

Juniors to learn more about post-secondary opportunities

A "Post-Secondary Fair," being held on Thursday, April 6, is aimed at helping 11th grade students learn more about a variety of opportunities after high school. Public Sky Show at U-46 Planetarium to focus on next year's solar eclipse

One year and two days before the next solar eclipse on April 8, 2024, the U-46 Planetarium is hosting a public sky show called "The Eclipse is Coming!"

There will be two hourlong shows on Thursday, April 6, beginning at 4:30 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. Doors will open at 4 p.m., and seating is



limited and on a first-come, first-served basis. Shows will include a brief history of the building, a look at the spring nighttime sky, and viewing tips and general information about next year's solar eclipse.

Safe-viewing eclipse glasses will be for sale for \$2 each.

Admission is cash only, \$2 per person, or a maximum of \$10 per family. The Planetarium is located at 312 Watch Street in Elgin, and there is free parking at Raymond Street and National Street, one block away. Find more information <u>here</u>.
