Two U-46 Buildings to be Featured in Open Elgin

School District U-46 will participate in the fourth <u>Open Elgin</u> on Saturday, April 29, by showcasing two of its buildings. The District sites will be among nearly 30 unique spaces and places available for free tours during the city-wide event celebrating the architecture and history of "The City in the Suburbs."



McKinley Elementary School will be open for tours from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. Originally called the Prospect Street School when it opened in 1887, it was the third elementary school built in Elgin. Its original features include cream-colored brick, limestone accents, and an arched entry. The school is located at 258 Lovell Street in Elgin.

Also open for tours from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. will be the <u>U-46 Planetarium and Observatory</u>; the Observatory was built and opened by the Elgin National Watch Company in 1910 and is on the National Register of Historic Places. The Planetarium is located at 312 Watch Street in Elgin.

Celebrate Children's Day at Elgin High School

School District U-46 will celebrate Children's Day (Día de los Niños) from noon to 2 p.m. on Saturday, April 29 at Elgin High School.

The free event will feature lots of fun activities, including crafts, a storytime, and face painting. A light lunch will be provided to the first 500 people who arrive. The first 200 families to arrive will receive a free book and a raffle ticket for a chance to win one of two iPads or one of three bicycles.

Elgin High School is located at 1200 Maroon Drive in Elgin. Attendees should enter through Door #7.



The event is organized and hosted by the U-46 Multilingual & Multicultural Education department and the Bilingual Parent Advisory Committee.
