Dear Colleagues,

It's beginning to look a lot like...snow! Or, now that December has arrived, at some point, it is going to look like snow. That spurs the annual question about whether or not we will use snow (or emergency) days if needed instead of a "remote instruction" day. The short answer: Yes.

Whenever inclement weather is expected, I am in regular contact with our Transportation and Plant Operations teams for updates. We continue to contract with a weather service that provides real-time alerts and updates for the entirety of U-46.

Everyone should read our <u>Emergency Closing Procedures</u>. This document provides additional guidance regarding who must work even when I call a "snow day," and also provides the process we follow for communicating the decision.

In U-46, we have not applied to the State Board of Education to use e-learning days in lieu of using emergency days. A primary reason for this decision continues to be my concern about meeting the needs of our students requiring specialized programming and instruction through "remote instruction." Additionally, there are implications for paying some of our colleagues who do not get paid when an emergency day is taken because that day gets made up at the end of the school year.

If the weather requires U-46 to close, then I hope our students and staff appreciate the ability to take a day to watch the snow fall, clear their driveways and sidewalks, drink hot chocolate, read, and then report to school to make it a great day to learn when streets are clear.

Regardless of whether we close due to weather or remain open, our top priority will always be the safety and well-being of our students and staff.
