As the data coach at Lords Park, I would like to recognize Lords Park teachers for their expertise in assigning accurate reading levels to their students. If these words of praise ring hollow, consider the facts. When compared to a normed test like i-Ready, the results of the F&P tests administered by Lords Park teachers during the 24-25 Winter window showed a robust correlation between the two variables. With a sample size of 420 student data points, the correlation coefficient (PCC) was 0.87, the linear regression analysis showed a strong goodness of fit (R2=0.76) and the variance analysis indicated the model is statistically significant (p<0.05). Lords Park educators show once again their professionalism and commitment to fostering the academic growth of each student. Their careful and thoughtful approach ensures that students are given the right resources to succeed and thrive in their reading development.
