Dear Colleagues,

Our Unite U-46 plan is moving forward, and as a school district, we have been gathering input on the preliminary attendance boundary recommendations that were shared with the Board of Education on December 9. With new and updated buildings preparing to open as soon as August 2025, starting with the transformed middle school in Bartlett almost complete, the final step is adjusting attendance boundaries to ensure optimal student placement and support for all learners.

We've been hosting community open house sessions, where community members are encouraged to drop in anytime to learn about the boundary recommendations, ask questions, and share feedback.

Each session focuses on a specific network, highlighting the schools within that group and their preliminary attendance boundary recommendations. However, community members are welcome to attend any session that works best for their schedule, regardless of the network. Spanish interpreters are also available at each session.
