Dear Colleagues,

This past week, I had the pleasure of attending the <u>Explore</u> expo on Thursday, Sept. 26, at the Now Arena in Hoffman Estates. Explore is hosted in collaboration with Alignment Collaborative for Education (ACE) and supports another essential student learning goal for "U-46 to update and enhance the wide range of college and career and technical education (CTE) pathways and magnet school programs."

The Explore event is a foundational experience for our middle school students exploring Educational Pathways, Magnet Academies, Career and Technical Programs, and the high-wage, high-demand careers that these programs lead to for students.

Our priority in School District U-46 is to ensure that every student **graduates college and career ready.** Two structures that support this work in different ways are Educational Pathways and the Magnet Academies. Students may choose to follow an Educational Pathway at their home high school starting in 9th grade or they may apply to attend a Magnet Academy for their time in high school.

To prepare for this learning event:

- Students completed a pre-lesson with school counselors and a post-lesson after attending the Explore expo
- Within each pathway students learned about:
 - Careers showcased by local industry partners
 - U-46 Magnet Academies
 - U-46 Career and Technical Education programs.

Then, during Explore, over 2,400 students from all eight middle schools visited the NOW Arena to see more than 60 exhibitors across 5 Career Pathways including: Arts and Communications; Finance, Business, IT and Culinary; Healthcare; Human and Professional Services; Manufacturing, Engineering, Technology and Trades. Explore provides important resources to assist U-46 in addressing our Career and Technical Education goal specifically including:

- Engaging in outreach and communication to students and families to encourage participation in pathways and magnet school programs.
- Increasing collaboration with local business/industry.

The proposed middle school changes will also support this goal by providing students with updated and varied exploratory offerings to introduce pathways and magnet school programming; enhanced instructional spaces to support flexible learning needs specific to STEM, technology, and PLTW courses, among others; and teaming structure inclusive of teachers in various content areas to provide cross-curricular and problem-based learning opportunities in support of 21st-century learning skill acquisition.
