Dear Colleagues,

On Saturday, December 2, we hosted our latest Unite U-46 session and welcomed nearly 50 parents and community members, in addition to staff. During the session, we provided an overview of our recent Unite U-46 work, reviewed costs and other considerations associated with maintaining each of our schools, worked to quantify the number of elementary schools we will need going forward, and considered different planning scenarios.

This Unite U-46 work is directly connected to our goal that "U-46 will establish and operate equityfocused, inclusive, efficient, and safe learning environments." To help achieve this goal, the Board of Education approved significant recommendations earlier this Fall to address our middle schools, which include:

- Retiring Abbott, Ellis
- Additions to Kimball, Kenyon Woods
- Construction of a new middle school in Elgin

Additionally, through our Unite U-46 sessions, parents, community members and staff have provided us with some considerations for guiding our work as follows:

- Put students first
- Continue communication with the community
- Remain mindful of the rich history of our schools
- Increase equitable access to programs at more schools
- Ensure all schools are inclusive and accessible to all.

We also discussed design patterns of future ready learning environments to be:

- Engaging and student-centered
- Collaborative
- Flexible and adaptable
- Safe and welcoming

Thank you to our participants for providing guidance as we begin to make the facility changes needed to support our focus on standards-based learning and assessment, rigorous student tasks and assessments, and academic teaming.
