Dear U-46 Colleagues,

We are aware that there have been reports of federal authorities conducting operations in the communities that U-46 serves, including in neighborhoods near some of our school buildings. As of today, no federal authorities have approached our school property, and we have not been contacted directly by anyone associated with a federal agency.

School District U-46 follows and adheres to strict security practices to maintain the safety of our students and staff. Through this Weekly Message, I am writing to affirm that School District U-46:

- Requires a judicial warrant before enforcement officials may access U-46 schools. The law affirms U-46's right to require a judicial warrant.
- Requires a judicial order or parent consent before releasing student records/disclosing information to enforcement officials. The law requires this level of records protections.
- <u>Does not</u> ask for a student's or their family's immigration status during enrollment. *The law does not permit schools to ask for this information during enrollment.*
- <u>Never</u> asks for social security information from students. *The law does not permit schools to seek social security information from students.*

Simply put: School District U-46 complies with the law and safeguards students' civil rights.

No student or family should face discrimination, harassment, or bullying because of their race, ethnicity, religion, national origin, or immigration status. Our commitment to creating inclusive and safe schools focused on providing developmentally responsive instructional programming for all U-46 students is unchanged and unwavering.

Our approach to this matter is long-standing, and our practices to address the safety of students and staff are still in place. We are prepared to respond and support our sites if or when officials or agents arrive at schools.

- <u>Let's Talk</u> Please note that dialogues submitted anonymously cannot receive a response. If
 you want to shield your identity, but receive a response, please enter your name and email, but
 click the box that says "Hide your contact information from the district." U-46 will not receive
 your name or contact information, but the Let's Talk system will still let us respond to your
 message.

Finally, we ask that all families or households make sure their contact information is up to date in Infinite Campus and that you have designated multiple emergency contacts. Keeping this information current allows us to reach you quickly if needed and ensures that we can connect students with their trusted contacts in any situation. Please contact your school's front office to make these updates, which can also be made during the <u>registration process for the 2025-2026 year.</u>

Thank you for your understanding and support as we seek to maintain our schools as learning environments where our students can reach their full potential.

Kudos to Each and Every Staff Member at Huff Elementary School, from Erin Hart, at Huff Elementary School


