





Ontarioville Elementary School population is predominately Hispanic (90%). We are a Title I school where 87% of our students receive free or reduced lunch. We are a



What we are continuously doing at Ontarioville?

- Review student data
- Use data to drive instruction
 - <u>Disaggregated data by race</u>
- SBLA relevant, consistent, accurate, meaningful
- Implementing CCSS standards for our instruction
 - Rigor relevant, consistent,
 - Differentiation relevant
 - Scaffolding relevant
 - Rubrics consistent, meaningful
- Ensure inter-rater reliability consistent, accurate, meaningful
- Formative and Summative assessment relevant, meaningful

How do teachers analyze data?

PARCC Analysis

- This is a template that grades 4-6 teachers use in the beginning of the year to identify areas that they need to focus on with their students
- PARCC Evidence Statement Supporting Document
- Evidence Statement Analysis

From MAP to PARCC

- This is a template of what grade 3-6 teachers completed after MAP testing to determine which student they need to focus on for PARCC
- KIDS Assessment Analysis
 - Each Kindergarten review the KIDS data in the beginning of the year and after each testing period
- F&P Analysis
 - Each grade 1-2 teachers analysis their incoming students data in the beginning of the school year



Next Steps

- Board of Education approval of School Improvement Plans for 2019-2020.
- Schools identified as "underperforming" will work as a cohort to improve equitable outcomes for all students.
- Cabinet will research next steps to improve student outcomes for specific student groups.
- Synthesize the school feedback from Cabinet Data Reviews and determine district action plan and future resource allocation.
- Evaluate Cabinet School Data Review process with the intent of refining and continuing annually.
