ELGIN - In honor of Black History Month, School District U-46 is participating in the 15th annual Black History Family Festival on Saturday, Feb. 1 at the Gail Borden Public Library where six U-46 seniors will each receive a \$500 scholarship. The theme of this year's festival is "Unite, Rise Up, Celebrate!"
