Interim Superintendent Appointed

The U-46 Board of Education on Monday night appointed Dr. Suzanne Johnson as the interim superintendent for School District U-46. For the past five years, Johnson has served as the deputy superintendent of instruction for the District. Dr. Johnson is a graduate of Elgin High School who began her career teaching language arts at Canton Middle School in Streamwood. She later served as a divisional, associate principal, and principal at Bartlett High School. The interim appointment is effective Feb. 23. Current Superintendent Dr. Tony Sanders has been appointed the Illinois State Superintendent of Education, and his last day in U-46 will be Feb. 22. Learn more h

Learn How to Support a Special Needs Child Through Puberty

The Community Advisory Council's Specialized Student Services committee will host a virtual presentation at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Feb. 21, for parents of children with disabilities. "Supporting a Special Needs Child Through Puberty" will review biological, psychological, and social-emotional factors associated with puberty. It will explain current research and literature about modern



issues, such as gender identity, social media, and Covid-19-created vulnerabilities. A special lens and practical advice will be applied for children with special needs, including those with developmental delays, mental illness, and learning disorders. Presenters are pediatric psychologist Dr. Ann Weller and licensed professional counselor Cheryl Curry of Plum Tree Psychology. Honoring Contributions Made by Black Americans

As part of School District U-46 events celebrating Black History Month, U-46 will host an event on Friday, Feb. 24, at 7 p.m., at Larkin High School. It will feature a keynote speech from Roger Simmons, an adjunct professor at Judson University who provides instruction to students about cultural diversity. He also serves as Judson's Director of Diversity and Spiritual Development, working with the



university community to develop programs, policies, and practices that promote an institutional culture of diversity, equity, and inclusive excellence. His presentation is entitled "Power, Promise and Purpose: Our Gaze is Fixed!" All are welcome. For questions, please email <u>gifted@u-46.org</u>.

In addition, U-46 high schoolers are invited to attend a virtual panel with representatives from four Historically Black Colleges and Universities. This event is being sponsored by the Alignment Collaborative for Education and School District U-46. Parent Cafes

The U-46 Family Welcome Center hosts "Parent Cafés" regularly at schools throughout the District. During these events, parents have the opportunity to talk with other caregivers about the challenges and rewards of raising a family. They also learn about five "protective factors" — such as social connections and knowledge of parenting — that have been shown to keep children safe and families strong.



Through individual self-reflection and peer-to-peer learning, participants create strategies from their own wisdom and experiences to help strengthen their families. Participants leave Parent Cafés feeling inspired, energized, and excited to put into practice what they've learned!

Did you know that School District U-46 has a bond proposal on the ballot in the April 4 election? This proposal will give voters a unique chance to improve our schools, with zero-tax-rate-change. As previous debt from a referendum in the early 2000s is paid off, the District can take on new debt without changing the tax rate homeowners pay.
