They also learn about five "protective factors" — such as social connections and knowledge of parenting — that have been shown to keep children safe and families strong.

Bond Proposal Aims to Protect Community's Investment

This spring, community members in U-46 will be asked to vote on a **zero-tax-rate-change bond proposal** that will address essential school building needs, expand preschool opportunities, and ensure all U-46 schools have up-to-date safety and security features. This proposal will give voters a unique chance to improve our schools,



without increasing the property tax rate. As previous debt from a referendum in the early 2000s is
