## Make doctor's appointments now for 2023-24 health requirements

If you have a child who will be entering kindergarten, 6th grade, 9th grade, or 12th grade next school year (2023-24), the state of Illinois has certain health requirements for those students. For incoming high school seniors, that means proving they are up to date on their meningococcal vaccine. For students in the other listed grades, physical exams and certain immunizations are required.

You can find details on the requirements, as well as the necessary forms, in English and Spanish on this page, in the Health Services section of the U-46 website. Forms are due on or before Aug. 15, 2023.

Because of these required physicals, summers are always busy at the offices of pediatricians. Please schedule your doctor's appointments now! Families who have questions or need assistance locating a clinic for a physical or immunization should contact the nurse at their school.

#### Use your voice to help create new opportunities for students and families

Have you taken the **<u>5Essentials Survey</u>** yet? The results of this research-based survey help schools drive change and create new opportunities for students and families. At one elementary school, it resulted in a parent-led safety program. At one high school, it



prompted the creation of a program that connected students to a trusted adult in the building they could go to for help when struggling.

K-12 teachers and 4th through 12th grade students can take the 5Essentials survey during the school day, and U-46 encourages all parents to set aside 10 minutes to complete the confidential survey this week at home on your computer, mobile phone, or tablet. This survey is completely confidential and will never be connected to you or your student. It's available in English and Spanish. Parents and guardians can find the survey here.

While we ask parents to complete the 5Essentials Survey, we want families to know that we'll be issuing a second survey, this one only for students in 4th through 12th grades, between March 20 and March 24.

The Student Equity and Inclusion Survey was first administered in the spring of 2020 and every spring since. It asks students to tell us how well they feel included and represented in our U-46 schools. Their feedback will provide invaluable insights into their experiences and how to improve and adapt our district to better meet their needs. The survey asks important questions about diversity and inclusion, cultural awareness and action, and our students' sense of belonging. If a student doesn't feel like they have enough information to answer a question, they will be able to skip the item altogether.

#### Incoming kindergarten and 1st graders can become fluent in English and Spanish

The Dual Language informational sessions are aimed at parents and guardians who have children who will be in kindergarten or 1st grade for the 2023-24 school year. # Zero-tax-rate-change bond proposal will benefit kids and families

This spring, School District U-46 community members will vote on a zero-tax-rate-change bond proposal. If approved by voters, the bond proposal will fund the plan to replace and rebuild our oldest elementary schools, update elementary school buildings to support expanded preschool opportunities, and implement a true 6th



through 8th grade middle school model. The proposal will also address districtwide critical maintenance, safety, and security needs and improve equitable access to programs at more schools districtwide.
