## Don't Delay on Health Requirements

Summer just started, but it's time to ensure your child is #U46FirstDayReady. An important part of that is making doctor's appointments for children entering kindergarten, 6th, 9th, or 12th grade; they must submit proof before or on the first day of school that they have met state physical and immunization requirements for their specific grade level.

In addition, class schedules will be released on July 17 to middle and high school school students — but only if they're fully registered! That includes meeting the necessary health requirements and submitting the documents.

You can find details on the requirements, as well as the necessary forms, in English and Spanish on this page, in the Health Services section of the U-46 website. There are a number of options for submitting the completed paperwork; all are outlined on this page, but here are a few of the easiest:

- Submit the paperwork to a health secretary at one of our high schools between 7 a.m. and 3 p.m. on Wednesday, June 28, July 12, July 19, or July 26.
- Upload the required health documents as a PDF through Infinite Campus during the registration process.
- Scan the documents to create a PDF document and then email it to <a href="mailto:healthservices@u-46.org">healthservices@u-46.org</a>
- Drop off the documents at the U-46 Educational Services Center, 355 E. Chicago Street in Elgin on Monday through Friday, between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Learning happens everywhere, and this summer, young families in U-46 have a chance to enjoy "Learning on the Go."

The Elgin Partnership for Early Learning (EPEL), along with an array of community partners, bring family engagement activities to local neighborhoods on Monday through Thursday mornings in June and July.



Each Learning on the Go session features a bilingual storytime, activities to support kindergarten readiness and opportunities to check out library books. Children are sent home with materials to encourage learning there as well. At some sites, lunch will be served.

In addition, community partners help sign up children for health care appointments, early education programs, and other important services.
