Learn How to Guide Your Child Through Transitions

The Community Advisory Council's Specialized Student Services committee will host a virtual presentation at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Feb. 27, for parents of children with special needs.

WEPS

Did you know that School District U-46 has its own radio station? WEPS 88.9 FM went live in 1950 and has showcased a variety of content over the years. It's Illinois' oldest operating noncommercial, educational radio station.

Currently, you can tune in at 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on weekdays to listen to an assortment of programs created by U-46 high school students over the last decade. The programs feature music, news, sports, speech performances, and entertainment.

When student-produced content is not airing, the station broadcasts The Ideas Network from Wisconsin Public Radio (WPR), which is a mix of programs from the BBC, NPR, and WPR.

First Day Ready

Parents and guardians of children who will be in kindergarten or 1st grade next school year are encouraged to start learning now about U-46's award-winning Dual Language program. The knowledge will help parents make an informed decision on whether to express interest in having their child participate in the U-46 Dual Language program.

In the U-46 Dual Language Program, students learn academic subjects through both English and Spanish instruction. This setup allows English- and Spanish-speaking students to develop high levels of proficiency in both languages, while also excelling academically.
