At the session, we reviewed the recently Board of Education approved proposal to retire, rebuild, and renovate several elementary schools. This, along with the shift of 6th grade into middle schools, will require adjustments to the school attendance boundaries. Although these changes will not happen immediately, they will affect all grade levels. The feedback activity provides the opportunity for the community to help us prioritize the attendance boundary planning criteria and guidelines. 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HBCU Panel

U-46 high schoolers and their parents or guardians have two great chances this month to learn more about the opportunities available at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). A virtual panel being held at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, Feb. 27, will feature alumni from Jacksonville State University, Morehouse University, and Howard University. To attend this event, high schoolers and their family members should register in advance here to receive a confirmation email with the

information to join. This event is being sponsored by U-46 and the Alignment Collaborative for Education.

In addition, sophomores and juniors will be able to attend a session during the sophomore and junior postsecondary day on Tuesday, March 5, dedicated to HBCU opportunities and recruitment and support for Latino/a students. The session will include a panel of representatives from Chicago State University, Dominican University, North Carolina A&T and the University of Illinois at Chicago. School counselors will provide students with more information soon.



Learn How to Guide Your Child Through Transitions

The Community Advisory Council's Specialized Student Services committee will host a virtual presentation at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Feb. 27, for parents of children with special needs.

"A Guide to Navigating Your Child's Transitions in U-46 Special Education" will focus on the transitions that occur when a child moves from early childhood to kindergarten, from elementary to middle school, from middle to high school, and then from high school to life after graduation.

Following the presentation, attendees will choose a breakout room for a question and answer session specific to their transition period.


Foundation Scholarship
