Week 4 football roundup for DuPage County and Fox

It was a wild and controversial finish in West Chicago Friday as Wheaton Academy lost to Hope Academy 30-29.

It was already a crazy fourth quarter as Hope Academy (3-1, 1-1) scored and converted a two-point conversion to take a 30-23 lead with under a minute to play. It was the fourth lead change of the quarter.

Undaunted, Wheaton Academy rallied. The Warriors marched 80 yards in 16 seconds to close to 30-29 as time expired as Brett Kasper connected with Ben Dehaan on a 40-yard touchdown to make it 30-29. Unfortunately, the Warriors were then whistled for an excessive celebration penalty as two Wheaton players had their helmets off.

The officials assessed two 15-yard penalties on the Warriors, making the extra point a 50-yard attempt. Ethan Head, who had previously converted three field goals of 26,24 and

32 yards, saw his attempt fall three yards short.

Kasper had two touchdown passes and threw for 134 yards. Gino Spinelli had two rushing scores for the Warriors (3-1, 1-1).

Crystal Lake South 38, Hampshire 28:

Jake Christensen ran for three touchdowns and Caden Casimino ran for two others as Crystal Lake South rallied for the win. Trailing 14-7 in the second quarter, Crystal Lake South (2-2, 2-2) rattled off 24 consecutive points to pull away. The Gators piled up 237 rushing yards and 461 total yards.

Christensen had touchdown runs of two, eight and two yards and finished with 163 yards on 20 carries. Casimino had 55 yards on 14 carries with scoring runs of 19 and two yards. He was also 19-of-29 for 224 yards. JJ Semradek booted a 36-yard field goal. Luke Lacke threw three touchdowns and was 15-of-32 for 269 yards for Hampshire (1-3, 1-3).

Hinsdale South 24, Addison Trail 0:

Hinsdale South (2-2, 2-0) got a trio of touchdown passes from Langston Love (11-of-16, 178 yards). Love connected with Nathaniel Fundator on a 17-yard scoring pass, Sam Schuyler on a 45-yarder and Daxton Michales from 9 yards out. It was the second consecutive shutout by Hinsdale South which allowed just 53 rushing yards to Addison Trail (2-2, 0-2).

York 56, Oak Park 28:

York piled up 546 yards of total offense as the Dukes (4-0, 1-0) marched on. Sean Winton was 13-for-26 passing for 203 and three touchdowns. Two of those touchdowns went to Luke Mailander (5 receptions, 142 yards) including a 94-yard touchdown. Chris Danko had five receptions for 54 yards and a touchdown. He also had a 99-yard kickoff return. Jake Melion (18 carries, 156 yards) ran for a pair of touchdowns.

York's starting defense, led by Donato Balice (INT), Jimmy Conners (INT), Cole Ostendorf, Andrew Bricker and Joe Reiff, held Oak Park (1-3, 1-1) to 30 rushing yards and 10-of-28 passing.

Fenwick 17, St. Francis 16:

Fenwick (3-1, 1-0) turned out the lights on St. Francis. A power outage knocked the lights out for a short period of time with 10.8 seconds to play with Fenwick at the St. Francis 8-yard line. When the lights returned, Fenwick's Noah Sur kicked a 25-year field goal for the game-winner.

The Spartans (2-2, 0-1) had taken a 16-7 lead early in the fourth quarter on a 29-yard field goal by Jack Augustine, a 51-yard touchdown pass from Alessio Milivojevic to Zachary

Washington and a one-yard touchdown run by Tyvonn Ransom.

Streamwood (1-3, 1-3) took an early 6-0 lead. But it was all Glenbard South (4-0, 4-0) from there. Michale Champagne would throw three touchdown passes and run for a 47-yard touchdown and add a conversion run. Bartlett's run game wears down Elgin

Call it old-school, smashmouth, grind-it-out ... but whatever it's called, it describes **Bartlett's** offense to a T.

And Milan Vuckovich couldn't be happier about it.

Using its 1-2 sophomore punch of tailback Joey Caputo and fullback Isaac Harris, the Hawks downed **Elgin** in the second half and pulled away for a 35-14 Upstate Eight victory Friday in Bartlett.

Harris ran for 200 yards and 2 scores and Caputo added 178 yards and a score. Quarterback Vincent Yario threw for a touchdown and ran for another.

The teams were tied at 14 at halftime, but the Hawks broke it open after intermission. Harris scored his first touchdown from 10 yards out, breaking several tackles along the way, to make it 21-14. The score capped a 2-play drive, the other of which was his 50-yard run.

It was all Harris on the Hawks' next possession as well. He carried it 7 straight times, capping it off with a 3-yard burst for the score.

Caputo added the clincher on a 3-yard run with just over 3 minutes to go.

As the game wound down, the Hawks appeared to wear down the **Elgin** defense as Harris and Caputo picked up yardage in big chunks.

"We told those linemen, 'This is on you,' and they did exactly what we needed them to do," Vuckovich said. "And we found something with those two, the big fullback and the bigger tailback. They just went downhill and that was old-school, **Bartlett** football right there."

After a scoreless first quarter, the Maroons struck first. When Bartlett's field-goal attempt was blocked, Jeremiah Hill scooped up the loose ball and raced 75 yards the other way.

After **Bartlett** answered on Yario's scoring run, the Maroons took the lead again. They took advantage of a short field following the second of Julian Carlson's 2 interceptions, with Dward Ward taking it in from 8 yards away.

Bartlett could move the ball through the air when it had to. Late in the half, Yario found Jacob Caradine for a 38-yard score. The Hawks got the ball back late in the half and completed 2 more passes on the next drive but ran out of time at the **Elgin** 40-yard line.

Carlson nearly had a third interception just before halftime.

For the game, Yario completed 4 of 14 passes for 81 yards. All of the completions and all but one of the attempts came in the first half.

The Maroons alternated Nick Avina and Ward at quarterback. Neither could get much traction as a passer as both were plagued by drops. Ward finished as **Elgin's** leading rusher with 95 yards.

- Daily Herald -Two goal-line stands help South Elgin shut out Larkin

But the pesky Royals did not make it easy for the Storm in the Upstate Eight contest. Twice, Larkin move the ball within ten yards of the goal line. Both times, **South Elgin's** defense made goal-line stands to keep the Royals off the board.

Larkin also had new quarterback. Aden Mora, a sophomore call-up, guide the team's offense throughout the entire game.

"It always good to get a win in conference play and it was a tough one. When we needed to make plays, we did," said **South Elgin** coach Dragan Teonic. "They had two very nice long drives. We bulked on the goal line and made the stops."

Mora did not have much time to prepare for his new role.

"He had two days of practice and I thought he did an outstanding job with trying to digest as much of the offense as he could," Larkin coach Vincent Ray said." He played with some tremendous heart."

South Elgin (4-0, 4-0) wasted no time in getting on the scoreboard, scoring on the opening kick-off. Brandon Berrios caught the kick and after recovering his own fumble, raced 80 yards to put the Storm up 7-0, 17 seconds into the contest.

"When the ball was kicked, I thought I was going to catch it because I was under it but it slipped out of my hands," Berrios said. "But I knew I keep the play going. So, I took the ball and my blockers led the way to the touchdown."

Larkin (1-3, 1-3) came close to tying the contest on its first possession. The Royals marched 63 yards on 11 plays to **South Elgin's** 7-yard. Facing fourth and goal, the Storm defense stopped fullback Diyonnes King in the back field to end the drive.

South Elgin scored 3 second quarter passing touchdowns to open up the game up. Quarterback Jack Ginnan connected with Jabari Pruit for a 22-yard TD score 58 seconds into the period. The junior also teamed up with Berrios for a 16-yard score. Ginnan closed out the second half finding Ishmael George, his favorite target in the end zone and completing a 23 -yard pass with 7.9 seconds left in the half. The Storm led 29-0 at halftime.

Ginnan completed nine of 14 attempts for 151 yards. George caught five for 84 yards. **Larkin** opened the second half with another long, time-consuming drive that moved the ball to the Storm's 2-yard line. This drive stalled out on an offensive foul and the Storm defense preventing a fourth down conversion.

Nicolas Barkho (7 carries for 54 yards) scored **South Elgin's** final TD on a 4-yard run at the 9:18 mark of the fourth quarter.

The victory was **South Elgin's** 28th conference win in a row.
