Elementary Report Cards Available Today

The first trimester report cards for elementary students are now available on Infinite Campus.

Parents and guardians have access to the Infinite Campus Parent Portal through a unique username and password. Please <u>click here</u> to sign in to your Infinite Campus Parent Portal account. <u>This section</u> of the U-46 website has information on report cards, grading, timelines, and Illinois Learning Standards; click <u>here</u> for



step-by-step directions on how to access your child's elementary report cards in your Infinite Campus Parent Portal account.

As a reminder, in-progress grades are always available in Infinite Campus, along with information about your child's attendance, teacher's contact information and bus schedule if applicable. In-progress grades allow parents to monitor how their child is doing in class without waiting until the end of a trimester and ask questions of a teacher on how to provide additional support to their child who might be struggling with a concept or skill.

Beginning with the 2024-25 school year, reported grades for students will be a combination of a student's demonstration of mastery through summative, formative, and intentional practice work. School Board Members Day






American Education Week

New Middle School in Bartlett - Naming Suggestions Needed!

Our district is excited to share that the construction of the new middle school in Bartlett is coming along nicely and remains on schedule to open its doors in the 2025-26 school year to serve our community! As part of the process, we invite input on potential names for the school. Per U-46 Board of Education Policy 4:150 Facility Management and Building Programs, naming decisions reflect our values and honor local history, geography, or notable



individuals who have contributed to education or the community. Board Policy 4:150 specifically states:

If named after a person, the following guidelines shall govern the naming of facilities:

- 1. The names of living persons shall not be considered.
- 2. The nominee must have made a significant contribution to society.
- 3. The name should lend prestige and status to an institution of learning.
- 4. The nomination shall be presented in a brief three-paragraph statement which shall contain:
 - 1. Biographical data.
 - 2. The significant contribution.
 - 3. A statement of why a school should be named after the person.
